### Race Report — British Championships Round 1

Fatcats Track near Doncaster UK ... 11th March 2012

#### The week leading up

The team woke up in Belgium on the Monday leading up to our first 2012 British Championship round knowing it was deep sand at Fatcats track this coming weekend. After Monday planning and rest day and a good clean up we were straight to Honda Park in Balen Tuesday and then to the Lierop GP track for practise on the Wednesday.

Both days proved very important with the likes of Jeffrey Herlings, Strijbos and Bobryshev and other world class GP riders on the same track. Hamish and George could watch and gauge why these guys were at the top of the world., Quite simply they were fitter, stronger and faster, and did things all around the track that our riders did not or could not. A great means of





comparison that is for sure. Herlings would make every table top, every double and unless passing do everything the same every lap; adjusting only as track conditions changed. His share corner speed gave him the momentum to reach these obstacles. His factory bike helped but our bikes are not slow so this was little excuse for our men. We clocked every lap and made positive comparisons.

"Our boys only need to find about 6-8 seconds a 2 minute lap to be world class ... in fact this is not easy to gain and in MX a lot to be done. But it is possible if we think about needing 0.25 seconds each corner and 0.5 seconds on other obstacles such as jumps. Simple as that and why we are here!"

We travelled back to the UK on Thursday and after a small mishap with Hamish and a passport being left in Lommel, costing an extra 6 hours driving, we where back in Sussex getting the trailers ready and bikes perfect for leaving Saturday 7.00 am. The drive to Doncaster is about 4 to 4.5 hours so both vans and trailer rigs stayed close throughout the journey.

Right: How our rigs go off to races. "One Mercedes Sprinter Van has 6 seats and a extra bed with room for 3 bikes and gear. The other Merc has 3 seats and a workshop on board with generator, air, work bench and all our spare parts ready for easy access. The same van can carry 6 bikes and is fully carpeted as a changing room for the riders. One race trailers has a living area, huge shower that mudded riders can change in. WC, TV,



fully fitted kitchen and bar area. The other trailer has a bunk room and double berth to sleep up to 10 people" We carry 20 tyres and wheels. A 4 and 8 mtr pop up tent and all accessories to put on the show we need as a professional race team.

His second race was a good start and good run. In 25th he fought through to 18th well. Later it was reported that a lot of teams had technical faults causing riders to pull out early.

The third race simply did not happen. His bike would not start and before we could change controls to the spare bike the start gate area was closed. Since we have found a faulty kill switch. Motocross has a rider and support team .. Both have to perform for success. We all understood this and took the day on the chin. Overall a successful experience and a lot learnt. "If we keep learning we keep progressing ..."
