Our 450 MX1 UK mount George Baldwin showed his worth with a sound 17th place ... please read on.









Here is Hamish's report of Round 3 British ACU Champs at Lyng ...

Dear All,

As the weather was not very good leading up the the 3rd round of the brits. I expected the track to be real wet and muddy but when we arrived the track was mint! Perfect condition and was prepped so good! I liked the look of the track with its uphills and drop offs it seemed quiet sandy, and ended up real soft and loamy but very hard underneath which made it very slippery and got very rough.

On Sunday (race day) the weather was cold and a few small showers over the day. For qualifying the plan was to do 3 fast laps and 1 slow until he 15 mins was up. The track was very fast and I had trouble getting a consistent fast lap in with out making a mistake, but no excuses because the other riders had to ride the same track. I came in at 35th position, for me this was very disappointing and left me with a bad gate pick. My 3 starts were not very good, around the mid pack area.

In Race 1 I was in around 17-18 position but unfortunately on the second lap had a crash which put me in about 28 place. The track was very one lined and hard to pass but got through to 23 by race end. It is so challenging because from 15th - 30th most of he riders are at the same pace.

Race 2 was better although i found myself getting pushed around a bit by other riders and nearly taken down a few times. Finished in 19th place.

Race 3 I found myself going back and fourth with riders in the opening laps, after settling into the race i ended up 18th. The whole day I didn't feel comfortable on the bike. I thought I was riding nervously and trying not to fall instead of charging and attacking the rough track. Plenty to work on.

Thanks all ... we are now focused on Milton Park Round 4 and back in Belgium training and racing. Cant wait !! HAMISH HARWOOD
